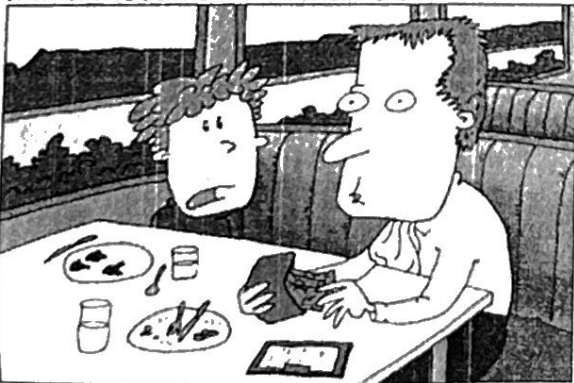

## ❖ Consistory Thank You:

We, the Consistory, would like to thank all those on our research committee for taking their time and effort researching our different options concerning our possible split from the UCC.

This has not been an easy process.

Thank you for all the hours you put into this to inform the congregation on the different options, which was the goal of the consistory

We wanted the congregation to be well informed before any decision could be made.

- ❖ On August 18, 2024, **Josie Mae Reed** was baptized during the worship service surrounded by four generations of her family and in front of a congregation of witnesses. Congratulations, Josie and family. May God's love and grace surround you, fill you and grow with you.



- ❖ **Altar Flowers** for the month of August were provided and produced by Ann Weber.

- ❖ **St. Paul's Auxiliary** – Our auction was reported with a total of \$317.00. This was sent to the Auxiliary of St. Paul's in Greenville. Then after the check was in the mail, we had a donation of \$200.00, so this was also mailed. Our total from our White Elephant Sale was \$517.00. We have already received a thank you for both donations.

## PARADISE UCC AND THE LUTHERAN CHURCH

A congregation was organized of Reformed and Lutheran people in 1827 by the Rev. John Althouse, a Reformed Circuit Rider Minister and they met in a local barn. A hewn log church was built in 1842, called the Union Church near where Strouse's Store was located. Due to the great distance to travel it seemed more convenient to hold Sunday School for both Lutheran and Reformed in the old Bonnett School House, very near the Reformed Church. The group separated in 1873 when the Lutheran congregation built a church; and the Reformed congregation built a church on the present location in 1875, on ground donated by Jonas Pifer. The building cost \$3,000 and a basement was dug underneath it in approximately 1922.

June 25, 1967 the Evangelical and Reformed Churches united with the Congregational Christian Churches to form the United Church of Christ. The church was remodeled in February, 1960, costing \$11,000.


The Rev. Barry Fillman became our Pastor September, 1968 and retired in 2009. In April, 1972, the Paradise Lutheran Church and the Paradise United Church of Christ both dissolved and formed a new church called the Paradise Community United Church of Christ. An addition doubling the church size and costing \$45,000 was done in 1977. A new roof was added in 2019 at a cost of \$18,450. The bell was taken from the Lutheran Church and installed at the United Church of Christ and it still rings before church every week.

### LUTHERAN CHURCH IS NOW CALLED THE YOUTH CENTER

The summer of 2024 a new roof was put on the Youth Center at a cost of \$16,200. It was in very poor condition and we had lots of dead birds inside any time we had to clean it. Not fun to pick them up!

Suddenly as we were driving by the Youth Center we were shocked to see someone had painted the foundation, some doors, the side porch and the old church looks beautiful. It is so nice to see an old Church looking great. The main event that we hold in the building is the Bethlehem Walk every other year. Then the questions began "who painted this?". We finally got it figured out that Gary Fillhart painted it and he also painted some of the foundation & steps at the Community Building. THANK YOU GARY!!!

## Back from Mongolia!

Dear Ministry Partners,

So many amazing stories from Mongolia are swirling around my mind! It was so hard to sit down and pull just one out for you! So, I made a list of all my stories to get them out of my head so I can start writing. Over the next few months, I will share more stories!

But to start, the Centurions Team (the name of Cru Military in Mongolia) is so amazing! The staff members there are all young and on fire for the Lord. Every one of them has an amazing story of how they first heard about Jesus and how they chose to follow Him. Then, they can tell you who disciples them and how they shared Christ and made disciples, too! They literally could make a "Spiritual Family Tree" and track generations of disciples making disciples! The stories were so incredible and so inspirational! I recorded our interviews to write the stories of these amazing missionaries to inspire others.

The first week I spent a lot of time in the offices for Mongolia Campus Crusade for Christ and the Centurions Ministry (office signs in the photos to the right). The team had many plans for me—from teaching the team new support-raising ideas to meeting with staff and military servicemen about future projects to help military families. In between those meetings, I interviewed staff and gathered their stories about ministry in Mongolia. I was tired after that week!

In the second week, I visited a camp that was ministering to handicapped kids. I had heard several stories about staff members first hearing about Jesus and starting to follow Him at that camp. It was a beautiful place just exemplified the love of God. I sat with the kids as they were hearing about how amazing Jesus is. I was falling in love with Jesus all over again, too. I believe God has big plans for that camp in the future.

Finally, I got to join the Centurions Team for their staff retreat. One of the staff members coordinated the retreat at her family's nomad camp. As far out into the Mongolian wilderness as you can imagine with no roads, running water, or electricity. But in that valley with "gers" (the Mongolian name for yurts) and goats, God showed up to renew the team—and me.

**Thank you for sending me to Mongolia!** I gathered information, stories, and ideas. Now I will meet with the regional directors and the Mongolian director and see what God is doing with all these pieces. Knowing God, it is going to be AMAZING!



I had the honor of joining the Centurions Team for their staff retreat far from the city at a Nomad's Camp. They asked me to lead devotions two of the days, but they inspired and taught me so much more than I helped them!



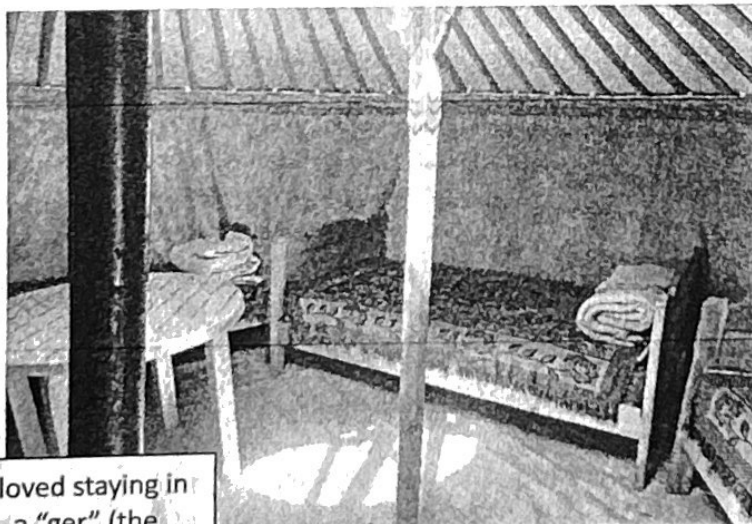
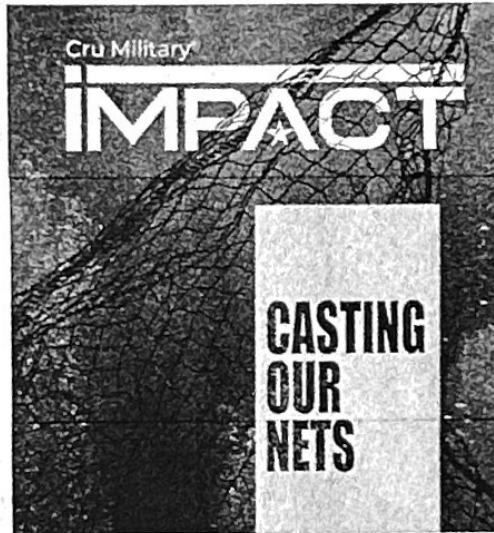


# The Impact Magazine

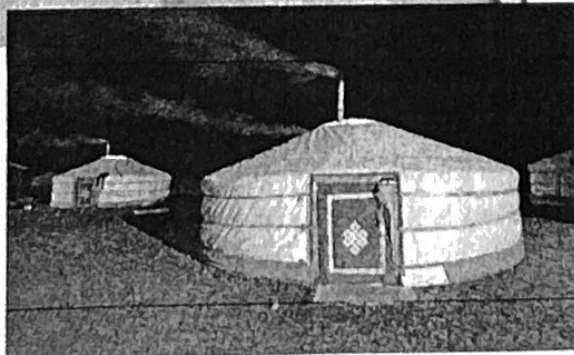
